SIXTH Form students at Epping St John's Church of England School celebrated their A-level success last week with all students passing their courses.

The 44 Year 13 students eagerly opened their results at the sixth form centre on Bury Lane, Epping, after completing their exams.

In total, 70 per cent of students managed to secure their first choices for university or placements, with graduates heading off to Kent, London, Sussex and Canada.

Every student achieved at least a pass in either an A-level or BTEC course.

Among them was Will Jones, 18, from Epping, who picked up A in English literature, B in geography and B in history. He is off to Cardiff University – a Russell Group university – to study journalism.

He said: "I am not sure whether I want to go into broadcast or print journalism, but this course will give me a taste for all areas and enable me to choose the path I want to go down."

"My teachers have been really good in all subjects; they have been really supportive. The small class sizes have meant we have built up good bonds with our teachers. They were so happy for us to get good grades, so that is really nice."

Alex McKeon from Abridge was also delighted with his results receiving two A grades in maths and extended project and

two B grades in chemistry and physics.

The 18-year-old is off to study electrical engineering at Brunel University where he hopes to work on more efficient energy supplies for the country.

Nina Honey was pleased to receive a Merit in Engineering after completing her BTEC course and is looking forward to starting her apprenticeship with TFL in September.

Cleo Doncaster, 18, of Roydon, and Elisha Wood from Epping are both off to Anglia Ruskin University to study adult nursing and midwifery respectively.

Miss Doncaster was happy with her distinction in BTEC health and social care while Miss Wood landed a scholarship with the Chelmsford-based campus following her results.

Chloe Kyriakou, 18, from Roy-

don, was pleasantly surprised with her grades by achieving A* in history, A in English literature, A in religious studies and B in sociology. She is planning to study English literature at the University of Sussex.

Fulin Baki, head of sixth form, said: "I am delighted with this year's A-level results. The students' hard work and dedication over the last seven years has shown in their achievements and today we are celebrating their reward."

"Many of our students have achieved places at their university of choice and some have exceeded expectations. "I wish all students the best for their future and I am looking forward to celebrating success again in years to come."
