A SECONDARY school is encouraging more students to read by starting their day enjoying a book in groups.

Form time reading has been introduced to Year 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12 students at Epping St John's Church of England School, in Bury Lane, Epping.

The move is to further build the profile of reading at the school, as well as giving pupils the basic skills they need to access the curriculum.

Assistant head teacher Naomi van der Lith said: "Reading has a knock-on effect in all subjects.
